About Ibstock Place School

Ibstock Place School is an independent coeducational day school for pupils aged 4 to 18. The school occupies a ten-acre site on the edge of Richmond Park in South-West London.

An urban location with a beautiful botanical feel, lbstock is the perfect home for scholarly exploration and adventure. Championing co-education since our founding in 1894, we have created a diverse environment that reflects real-world communities and workplaces.

Our school is oversubscribed, with assessed entry at the age of four for Kindergarten (Reception). There is a competitive entry examination at the age of eleven, and most pupils in the Prep School proceed on into the Senior School.

The Music programme at lbstock is ambitious, wide-ranging, and strong both practically and academically.

Every pupil is encouraged to take part in Music as often as possible, whether this be in the classroom, in assemblies, rehearsals, or concerts.

Our goal is to inspire pupils and enable them to unlock their full musical potential.

We pride ourselves on the many ensembles on offer. Our choirs include the flagship Schola

Cantorum (liturgical choir for Years 9 to 13), our recently formed lbstock Choristers (Year 3 to

Year 8), and smaller vocal groups. We have large-scale instrumental ensembles including Senior Chamber Orchestra, and there are many chamber groups, encompassing strings, woodwind, and brass, overseen by specialists. Our rock and pop provision is well-established and there are auditioned rock bands in every year group.

In short, if a pupil wants to make music, there is something for everyone at every standard.

Performance opportunities include weekly assemblies, monthly recitals, half termly evensongs, end-of-term large-scale concerts, music competitions, performances in the local community, and whole school services.

Music scholars have the opportunity every year to perform with the Berkeley Ensemble, our professional ensemble-in-residence.

We run an annual choir tour abroad (recent locations include Tuscany, Malta, and Prague, and the destination for October 2024 is Budapest), and we also organise concert trips to London venues.

Pupils at Ibstock regularly take up places as members of the National Youth Choir, National Youth Orchestra, National Youth Music Theatre, National Children's Orchestra, National Youth Jazz Collective, Rodolfus Choir and London Schools' Symphony Orchestra.

Pupils also regularly take part in local competitions and events, such as the Barnes Music Festival, and some attend junior conservatoires on Saturday mornings.

We have healthy numbers of pupils studying Music at IGCSE (CIE) and A Level (Eduqas), as well as a bespoke musical curriculum encompassing keyboard skills, singing, composing, and music technology across KS3.

Examination results in Music are excellent: 94% A*-A equivalent at IGCSE, and 74% A*-A equivalent in the Sixth Form over the past five years.

Across the whole age range of the school, roughly 45% of pupils learn at least one musical instrument, and performance in practical examinations (ABRSM, Trinity, Rock School, LCEM) is stellar.

Pupils regularly go on to study prestigious Music courses at top universities and conservatoires, including, in recent years, Oxford, Durham, Manchester, Guildhall, Trinity Laban, and the Royal Northern College of Music.



Responsibilities

- Accompanying pupil performances, rehearsals, assemblies, and ABRSM and Trinity exams. Ability to play the organ would be desirable but is not essential.
- Leading rehearsals and coaching smaller ensembles.
- Assisting with the general administration of the department, including:
- -supporting the Director of Music and Expressive Arts Administrator as required.
- -overseeing the music library and preparing sheet music as required.
- -liaising with Visiting Music Teachers (VMTs) to prepare for concerts.
- Teaching KS3 classroom lessons and assisting, where needed, with KS4 & KS5 (depending on specialism and interest).
- To help prepare pupils for the aural component of practical examinations and provide general music theory support.
- To participate in a range of co-curricular musical activities, including involvement with ensembles (depending on the candidate's interests) and attending school concerts/trips/services.
- To aid in the stage management of largerscale school concerts.
- To play a role in the delivery of the music outreach and partnerships programme.

Person specification

- Is an accomplished pianist and/or organist with experience of accompanying.
- Has experience, or an interest in, leading ensembles.
- Is organised, self-motivated and has a cando attitude.
- Has a positive, warm and enthusiastic personality.
- Has music expertise, likely an undergraduate Music Degree, or has been actively involved in music at a high level.
- Has an interest in entering the teaching profession and working with young people.
- Wants to be fully involved in a vibrant school community.
- Has the ability to inspire, motivate and enthuse young musicians.
- Has strong communication skills.

The role will often involve working outside of normal timetabled hours e.g. concerts and trips after school and occasionally weekends. On these occasions plenty of notice will be given and there is scope to be flexible with working patterns in light of these occasions.
